FAREWELL AS EDITOR OF THE PEWSHEET AND E-NEWS - After eleven years of supporting the Revd Robert by editing and producing the pewsheet and e-news I am stepping back from this work. - Print nearly 100 copies and distribute to the three churches of the parish
- Prepare and schedule the e-mail version (the e-news) with photos and additional content (for example the Bishop's weekly message) that don't fit on the A4 printed version, to mail at 4.00 p.m. every Saturday.
- Update each church website so links on the 'news page' point to the latest online version of the e-news

If you are interested in taking this on then I am sure they would like to hear from you. This will be my last week in the role. I hope most will have found this service useful during the past eleven years I have provided it.
